RULES AND REGULATIONS: SUMMARY

- 1. <u>HOURS</u> All New Castle County parks are open year-round. Hours of operation are dawn to dusk, except with permission of the Department.
- 2. <u>**TEMPORARY CLOSURE**</u> The General Manager has the authority to temporarily close a museum or the grounds when required by Public Health, Safety and Welfare.
- <u>MOTOR VEHICLES</u> No motor vehicles shall be driven except in areas specifically designated for their use. All motor vehicle laws of the State of Delaware must be followed.
- 4. <u>POSTING</u> No signs or markers can be put in place, except with written permission of the Department. Sales or solicitation are also generally prohibited.
- <u>ALCOHOL, DRUGS AND GAMBLING</u> Consumption, possession or sale of alcoholic beverages or illegal drugs is prohibited. Gambling is also prohibited.
- 6. <u>DAMAGE AND DUMPING</u> Vandalism of trees, shrubs, plants, turf, rocks, buildings, fences, bridges, signs, stream water quality or any other natural or man-made asset of the park is prohibited. Nothing may be dumped in the park.
- 7. <u>FIRE</u> No fires shall be kindled.
- SAFETY OF ANIMALS No one shall trap, snare, shoot, poison, injure, annoy or disturb any wild animal or bird or damage any nest.
- 9. <u>DISORDERLY CONDUCT</u> Threatening, abusive, insulting or indecent language, obscene or indecent actions and fighting are prohibited.
- **10.** <u>WEAPONS</u> No one shall carry any knife having a blade three (3) inches or longer on the grounds. The possession or discharge of BB guns, air guns, firearms, bows and arrows or any lethal weapon is prohibited.
- **11.** <u>ACTIVITIES</u> Entertainment, demonstrations or exhibitions are prohibited, except with the approval of the Department.
- 12. <u>GROUP FUNCTIONS</u> Permits for group activities should be obtained in advance from the Department.
- 13. <u>NOISE</u> Loud music is not permitted. Please be respectful of your neighbors.
- 14. <u>DOGS</u> Dogs must be kept on a leash at all times. Please, pick up after your dog.



Rockwood Park is one of the most unique parks in Delaware. The Rockwood Mansion, which is on the National Register of Historic Places, is considered an outstanding example of Rural Gothic architecture.



Rockwood was home to two of Wilmington's most prominent families-Joseph Shipley, who started construction of the house in 1851, and Edward Bringhurst and his family from 1891 until 1965.

In addition to the manor house and conservatory, the estate is comprised of a porter's lodge, gardener's cottage, barn and other ancillary structures.





Rockwood Mansion is surrounded by the 6 acre Historic Garden. Both garden and mansion were completed in 1854.

The garden resembles an English park and follows the principles of the Gardenesque landscape design. Its beauty is derived from the many trees and flowering shrubs that are arranged in a naturalistic manner.

HIKING TRAILS

Admission to the park is free. The garden and grounds are open daily from dawn to dusk.

Rockwood Park is the perfect location for a casual stroll along the trails that show a variety of views through the park. More than two miles of lighted walking trails wind their way through Rockwood's 72 acres. Paved trails are available for walking, running or bike riding.

THE MUSEUM

The Museum, located in the east side of the Mansion, is open for tours Wednesday - Saturday from 10:00am to 4:00pm., and Sunday noon to 4:00pm. Tours begin on the hour. Museum Admission includes the current exhibit in the museum.


SPECIAL OCCASSIONS


The spacious North and South Lawns are available to rent for weddings and our Parlors are also available for business meetings and family get-togethers.
